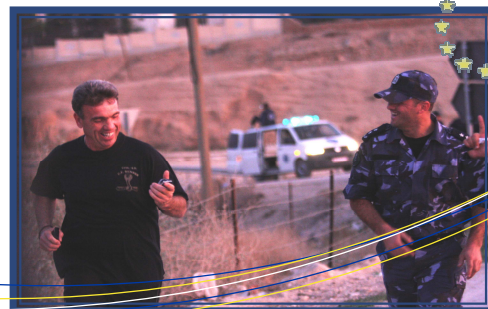




## Head of Mission met with Palestinian Prime Minister

EUPOL COPPS' Head of Mission, Commissioner Henrik MALM-QUIST met with Palestinian Prime Minister, Dr Salam FAYYAD, in Ramallah. They discussed several topics related to the Security situation in the West Bank, in particular the European Union's support to the Palestinian Security and Judicial Institutions.



## EUPOL COPPS and the Palestinian Bar Association opened 5th Legal Library in Hebron

Since the beginning of the year, 4 other legal libraries have been opened in Bethlehem, Tulkarrem, Nablus and Jenin, within the framework of a German sponsored project.

This German contribution of \$100,000 USD to the Justice Sector has been implemented by the Palestinian Bar Association, with support from the Rule of Law Section of EUPOL COPPS.



## EUPOL COPPS and Palestine General Administration of Reform and Correction Centers (GARCC) opened Bethlehem Rehabilitation Center which was funded by the Dutch government.



## Human Rights

The human rights expert and police training advisors facilitated a workshop between the PCP and Women's Centre for Legal Aid and Counselling (WCLAC) which discussed how best to integrate gender and domestic violence issues into PCP training and on the ongoing needs assessment of PCP Family Protection Units (FPU). The expert facilitated access for a visiting British DFID (Department for International Development) Consultant to the Bethlehem FPU.



## EUPOL COPPS participated in the Palestinian Intermediate Leaders' Course

EUPOL COPPS participated in this Course jointly organized by the Palestinian Ministry of Interior and the Office of the United States Security Coordinator (USSC), General DAYTON.

EUPOL COPPS' representatives delivered a lecture on Civil Disturbance Management to 50 intermediate ranking officers from all branches of the Palestinian Security Forces attending this 4 week course.



## EUPOL COPPS supports Traffic Police in Bethlehem

EUPOL COPPS provided the Bethlehem Traffic Police with two alcoholmeters (breathalyzers), as well as the training for its use. Police Adviser Lars Ekström, who led this small project, also taught the participants how to fill in the template and how to do the sobriety test. These devices have proved very useful to the Traffic Police, that has already handed several cases over to the lower court in Bethlehem.

A meeting took place between EUPOL COPPS and INL (International Narcotics and Law Enforcement) to ensure future coordination in the field of criminal investigations.
