



First Palestinian Police-Prosecution conference

EUPOL COPPS and the U.S. Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs (INL) facilitated the first joint conference to strengthen coordination between Attorney General Office (AGO) and the Palestinian Civil Police (PCP). During two days, the participants had a review upon the 2010 AGO-PCP Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) and were introduced to U.S. and EU models of police-prosecution coordination, part of which will serve the purpose of consolidating police-prosecution cooperation in the oPt.



USD 270,000 Agreement to Enhance Anti-Corruption Efforts

The Palestinian Anti-Corruption Commission (PACC) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), supported by EUPOL COPPS, signed an agreement worth USD 270,000 to enhance anti-corruption efforts and increase citizen's participation in the occupied Palestinian territories. The agreement aims at supporting the implementation of the national anti-corruption strategy; conducting a comprehensive public perception survey; and initiating a major public awareness campaign.



EUPOL COPPS delivers evidence bags to Palestinian Police

EUPOL COPPS provided Criminal Investigation Department of the Palestinian Civil Police 20.000 evidence bags for biological seized items and 3.000 boxes for other seized items like hand guns. The bags and boxes will help CID and Anti Narcotics departments to better handle investigation.



Training support for Uniformed Police Officers

EUPOL COPPS police expert advised the Palestinian Civil Police in the preparation, implementation and finalisation of a training course for Uniform Police officers. The programme which is supported by EUPOL COPPS and in line with the best international practices in this domain, will allow the training of 1.000 police officers in less than 18 months. The term Uniformed Police designates the police which patrol and respond to emergencies and other incidents.



EUPOL COPPS donates IT equipment to the Police

EUPOL COPPS donated 11 laptops to the Palestinian Civil Police Logistics Department to address the needs of the PCP Inventory System. The laptops will be distributed to the 11 West Bank districts and connected with the centralized database thus monitoring the inputs and outputs more efficiently by using real time data transmission system.



Training assessment study trip in Germany

The Palestinian Civil Police attended a study visit to Germany to better evaluate and enhance their overarching training program. The visit supported by EUPOL COPPS and hosted by the German Federal Police (Bundespolizei) allowed PCP members to visit three separate training facilities and one operational policing site at which they received presentations related to the evaluation and assessment of training.
