



## Palestinian Civil Police inaugurates modern Prison in Jericho

The Palestinian Civil Police (PCP) inaugurated a modern Correction and Rehabilitation Centre in Jericho. The new prison is considered to be the first modern facility of its kind in the West Bank, built with the support of The Netherlands.

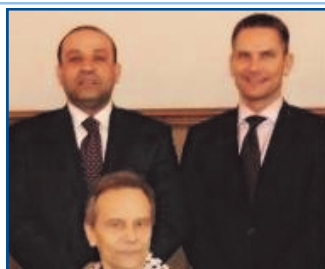
## Italy and Cyprus provide motorbikes to PCP
